## Meeting of the New Visitors of the Congregation of the Mission

The General Curia of the Congregation convoked this gathering which is being held in Rome at the house of the Daughters of Charity (January 8th-17th, 2018).

This has been a very positive and very opportune experience because as we undertake this ministry of service to the Congregation in the various provinces, it is necessary to be aware of the fundamental importance of the mission of the Visitor. Only in that way can the purpose of the Congregation be made effective during this historical era in which we live, that is, at the beginning of the fifth century of our charismatic life.

The Little Company is a work of God. That is what St. Vincent felt and experienced throughout his life and therefore we should have that reality in the forefront of our minds. That same reality should motivate us to have ever greater trust in Jesus Christ. If we are united in Jesus Christ (cf. John 15:7-12), then all our plans will move forward (despite any obstacles that might arise) and those plans will produce abundant fruit that will enable the Vincentian mission to continue in existence and to be fulfilled ever more effectively throughout the world.

We know that the secularization of humankind has affected our missionary labor and therefore we have an even greater responsibility and commitment. We also realize that we must allow the Holy Spirit, the Author of all that is good, to guide our hearts, thoughts, emotions and will (cf. Luke 22:42). In that way the Lord becomes the protagonist of the Mission and we, as members of the Congregation, become the Lord's fragile instruments ... as such, however, we become effective instruments in the

building up of the Kingdom of God.

During these days we have had the opportunity to reflect on our Vincentian roots and therefore, this has provided us with an opportunity to renew our vocation as Vincentian missionaries.

As Visitors we are called to live the charism of Vincent in a faithful manner and also called to be animated by his spirituality. In this way we will then be able to lead and to accompany the members of our distinct provinces in fulfilling the mission that has been entrusted to them.

Vocational promotion, initial and on-going formation as well as accompanying the larger Vincentian Family ... all of these need to be strengthened. Hope and trust in God ground us in these fundamental aspects which, at the same time, give growth to our beloved Congregation.

Each missionary is called to give a generous response to the vocation that he has been called to live. If we are faithful Vincentians, we will gain heaven here on earth precisely because mercy is the path to salvation and the Congregation is the place where we encounter the Lord and where we work out our salvation. May the Lord continue to bless our Congregation!

The annual meeting of the Vincentian Family Executive Committee (VFEC) convened in Philadelphia January 16-18, 2018 with its members arriving from seven countries.

Agenda items included the three day October 2017 Vincentian Family Symposium evaluation (Rome). Overwhelmingly the positive feedback of the 12,000 attendees continues to echo in every continent. This “touched the hearts” of not only those physically present but also those who continue to review the televised events, social media and symposium materials. The Committee reviewed what we learned from the experience and made decisions about how to continue reaping the fruits of the Holy Spirit sown that weekend.

Additional agenda items included: Finding Vince 400 Film Festival (October 2018), Homeless Alliance project, updates on Commissions and Task Forces, critical need for translators and the Vincentian Family data base update. Thanks once again to the Eastern Province of the CM for their gracious hospitality.

CM Frs. Astor Rodriguez, Abdo Eid and Charlie Plock; DC Srs. Bernadette Miller and Martha Beaudoin translated this meeting on site into French, English and Spanish.



## Vincentian Seminars

### I was a stranger and you welcomed me

Father Tomaž Mavrič, CM, was elected Superior General of the Congregation of the Mission in 2016 and his schedule has been filled not only with visits to the

various provinces of the Congregation of the Mission and the Company of the Daughters of Charity but also with events that have enabled him to participate



in meetings with the members of the worldwide Vincentian Family. In Sardinia we had the pleasure of his presence (the last two Sunday's in January) during the time of the Vincentian Seminars. These times of formation were initiated during the 1990's and continue to reveal the manner in which St. Vincent is esteemed throughout Sardinia. At the same time the participation of so many people in these encounters also manifests the witness to charity that is given by the Daughters, the Missionaries and all the members of the Vincentian Family.

These seminars were organized by the president of the Vincentian Family, Father Bruno Gonella, CM (superior and pastor of the parish of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal [Cagliari]). In order to facilitate the participation of the greatest number of people, one session was held in Cagliari (January 21st) and another in Sassari (January 28th). These sessions began with morning prayer, followed by a presentation given by the Superior General, the celebration of the Eucharist (presided by Fr. Tomaž), a meal, and dialogue with the superior general.

We were pleasantly surprised by the participation of so many members of the various groups and associations ... more than one thousand people participated in these formation sessions. The session in Cagliari was held in the chapel of the Daughters of Charity which was filled to overflowing. There was a family spirit and those present were filled with joy to be able to engage in a dialogue with the superior general.

Father Tomaž encouraged the participants to remain

faithful to their Vincentian vocation, to remain faithful to the call to care for and serve those men and women who are poor (especially refugees, immigrants and those people who have been abandoned and forgotten). Father also exhorted the Family to create a culture of vocations and therefore, to be active in encouraging and inviting people to become involved in some branch of the Vincentian Family.

Even though these seminars had very definite time limits, nevertheless, Father Tomaž found time to visit a confrere who was recovering from illness, to spend some time at the centers that are administered by the Daughters of Charity and that serve those persons who are poor. Father also spent some time at the houses of the Congregation and the infirmary of the Daughters.



In his dialogues, Father spoke about the importance of cultivating a devotion to the Vincentian saints, blessed, and Servants, encouraging everyone to become ever more knowledgeable about the lives of these holy men and women. Father spoke specifically about Sister Tambelli, Father Manzella, and Sister Nicoli.



The following words of Father summarize the many ideas and thoughts that he shared with us: When we began these celebrations that revolved around the 400th anniversary of the origin of our charism, we were aware of the fact that Saint Vincent did not want us to focus solely on the past. He wanted us to look toward the future and to create specific projects that would give new life to the Vincentian charism. At the same time Vincent wants us to reach out to those people who may have no knowledge about the good news of Jesus Christ. This can be done by strengthening the bonds of

collaboration among all the branches of the Vincentian Family, by working together in common projects, by promoting vocations to the worldwide Vincentian Family and by developing better communication.

## Invitation for III Encounter of the Vincentian Family

The International Formation Center, located in Paris, convokes the III Encounter of the Vincentian Family (April 10th – May 11th, 2018).

The Vincentian Family is composed of more than 225 branches of consecrated and lay persons. These many men and women follow in the footsteps of Vincent de Paul, Louise de Marillac, Frederic Ozanam, Elizabeth Seton and many other saints and they want to continue the mission of Christ by proclaiming the Good News of Jesus love to the poor (proclaiming that news by spiritual and corporal service).

As a family, we have concluded our celebrations in commemoration of the 400th anniversary of the origin of our charism. If we do not understand our charism then we will not be able to live an authentic Vincentian spirituality. This formation session provides the participants with (1) an opportunity to deepen one's understanding of the charism and (2) an opportunity to visit those places where our founders lived and ministered.

### Objective:

To offer the members of the various branches of the Vincentian Family formation with regard to the Vincentian charism ... and to do this through deepening their understanding of Vincentian ethics

and spirituality and through an analysis of the present-day social reality. It is hoped that this will, in turn, result in a greater globalization of charity in service on behalf of those persons most in need.

**Themes:** among the themes we highlight the following:

- Outstanding figures in the Vincentian Family
- Vincentian ethics and spirituality
- What is the Vincentian Family?
- Systemic change
- How to work together so that the dignity of the poor is respected.

### Methodology

We have opted for an “in person”, face to face methodology. This will involve intensive sessions with supporting didactic material (workshops, expositions, videos, written material). There will also be time for meditation and for prayer. Our focus will not only be on the past but looking at the present and projecting ourselves into the future. Our reflection will be done in light of Vatican II and the prophetic teaching of Pope Francis. The individual experience of each participant is most important: your ministry with those who

are poor, the manner in which you collaborate with members of other branches, your story, etc..

A significant part of this formation session will be the visits to the various Vincentian places, that is, the places where the numerous Vincentian saints lived and ministered in accord with the Vincentian charism. Thus, we will visit other places in Paris and other cities in France.

**Dates:** April 10th to May 11th, 2018

**Languages:** This session is for those individuals who speak Spanish, English or French (simultaneous translation will be available)

**Cost:** 2.200 Euros (includes lodging, food, excursions and material)

**Place:** the Motherhouse of the Congregation of the Mission located at 95 Rue de Sevres, Paris ... easy access to public transportation for travel to and from

the airport.

**Registration:** all registrations must be received by March 25th, 2018
